**Narrative Accomplishment Report  
2011 Gender and Development Program**

**1. Creation of Cotabato City Women's Council (CCWC)**

The Cotabato City Women's Council was reorganized through Executive Order No.47 series of 2010. This is chaired by Mindanao Tri People Resource Center and other nongovernmental organizations whose programs and services are geared towards women empowerment and development.

**2. Women's Month Celebration**

On March 2011 we celebrated the Women's Month and was spearheaded by the CCWC in coordination with the Cotabato City Government and other national line agencies. Among the activities conducted were parade, launching program, medical mission, Libreng Gupit Para sa Kababaihan and Palarong Pinoy para sa Kababaihan. About 700 hundred women participated in coming from different civic, religious and barangay organizations. Medicines were extended after the check up and prizes were also given to the winners of the palaro. It was a very successful celebration.

**3. Support to Gender Sensitivity Program**

The CCWC have conducted gender sensitivity training to the officers and members of their organization, about 20 of them have attended. Also, they reached out to the barangay level in conducting community education on gender issues and other concerns, 395 women and other leaders of the barangays have attended the activity. As part of our continuing advocacy on gender issues, they have also reproduced IEC materials distributed to offices, peoples organizations and barangay level. Likewise, the council spearheaded in coordination with Notre Dame University in the advocacy forum on Reproductive Health Bill and attended by 300 women and students as participants. To reached out more to the public, radio plugging was also done to advocate to response to women issues and laws and policies. Another important activity was the conduct of Cotabato City Womens Assembly attended by 208 women organizations. The assembly gave the opportunity for the participants to discuss experiences, issues and concerns. Different stakeholders also inputted their various programs and services available to both private and public agencies. The meat of the activity was in preparation of the initial plan for 2012 activities for women and gender concerns.

**4. Support to Kalipunan ng Liping Pilipina (KALIPI)**

As part of the continuing support to KALIPI organization of Cotabato City, the city had allocated budget to sustain their activities, such as participation in the Mutya ng KALIPI Regional Level, Women's

Month Celebration, lakbay - aral and travelling expenses in attending outside conferences, meetings and seminars .

5. Cash assistance to women in crisis situation

The city government under the GAD budget also provided support to women victims of rape and other forms of violence. One woman was extended cash assistance for her transportation expenses, others were only provided with referrals and counselling services and temporary shelter as needed by the victims.

6. Support to Women's Reproductive Health

In order to sustain advocacy at the barangay level on reproductive health and family planning, the city supported the 37 Barangay Service Point Officers as partners in the implementation of the said program.

7. Support to Maintenance and Operational Expenses of Women and Youth Protectory

This is a continuing project as a center for women and youth in conflict with law awaiting for the disposition of their cases. This was referred to the City Engineers Office for the rehabilitation of some parts of the building.

8. Productivity and Skills Capability Building for Disadvantaged Women (PSCB)


A skills training center specifically to sewing craft. For 2011, a total of 250 women graduated from the said training and were extended capital assistance to augment their income generating projects.

9. Cotabato City has already created the Cotabato City Anti-Violence and Trafficking against Women and Children .

10. Gender Sensitivity Training (GST)

Our office have also conducted the GST to forty (40) PNP personnel for them to understand and be equipped with knowledge on gender issues, likewise, as part of continuing advocacy and protection on women, forty (40) participants who are barangays leaders have attended the activity. It helped them to understand the role of women and men in their barangays.
